Kundig, Tom. "Essential Machines: Kinetic Architecture and the Human Experience". *Architectural Design.* (Vol 94, 2024). p.32-39.

"Kinetic architecture can also deepen our personal relationship to a building. Turning a wheel is a shared tactile experience between humans and architecture. Kinetics ask a user to take responsibility for their surroundings and consider the configuration of space, then to do the work of changing and adapting it. That can provoke an emotional response, as well as a sense of mindfulness about how they are occupying that space. It invites you to think about the impact of your decisions not just as a user or inhabitant but as a steward, a partner." (36).

#### Lubell, Sam. "Dispatch". The Architect's Newspaper. (January/February 2024). p.17-19.

"The three firms developed their scheme for the project competition before working with local offices to complete most of the landscaping and engineering. To cross this divide, the team proposed the Village Valley Mall, a recessed canyon that meanders for a half mile between the stadiums and beneath the street. It is dotted with circular, green-roofed pavilions that incorporate shops, restaurants, and cafes. All of this is supplemented with plant-filled outdoor gathering areas. This has become the project's social heart, and the site's divisions have been further linked via snaking pedestrian bridges-two over the roadway and six over the river-that inject a sense of kinetic excitement." Rao, Anjulie. "Is Every Building Worth Preserving?". *Dwell.* (November/December 2024). p.94-97.

"For more than two decades, the Saginaw Chippewa Tribe of Michigan (part of the Great Lakes Anishinaabe peoples) has been healing the wounds inflicted at MIIBS. With architect Christian Nakarado, the tribe is turning the abandoned boarding school buildings into a multifaceted memorial to help people remember what happened and the lives that were lost or profoundly altered there. They're also turning it into a place for cultural reconnection to ensure that the Anishinaabe language and the tribe's crafts, stories, and ancestral bonds remain unbroken despite a decades-long attempt at decimation." Reiner-Roth, Shane. "A Dynamic Courtyard". *The Architect's Newspaper.* (January/February 2024). p.39.

"Brunson Terrace, a 48-unit affordable housing project recently completed across the street from Santa Monica College, continues this trend by boasting every energysaving accolade one can reasonably expect. Designed by the Hawthorne, California-based firm Brooks + Scarpa, the LEED Platinum-status building achieves a Predicted Energy Use Intensity (pEUI) score of 6.6 thanks to a net-zero output-a true rarity for the building type." ### Ruhling, Nancy A. "Heavenly Dome". Traditional Building. (December 2024). p.58-60.

"By the time the dome at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine decided to refurbish it, it had suffered years of deterioration, water infiltration (buckets were put on the floor to catch the drips), and damage from two fires-one in 2001 and another in 2019. The church's original plan called for merely cleaning the interior tiles, but after extensive research and a comprehensive survey by NewYork City-based Ennead Architects, it was decided that the cathedral needed a new roof." Sokol, David. "Brown is the New Green". Dwell. (November/December 2024). p.70-77.

"D.C.'s regulations favor traditional city forms, which puts some constraints on a specific aesthetic agenda. A materials-driven architecture allows us to pursue our intellectual ambitions within this more conservative framework,' Jack says of what he and Linn call 'farm-to-shelter' architecture's appeal. Of course, the pair had to learn whether farm-to-shelter architecture was even possible. They first did so in the capital city's Anacostia neighborhood, where they had purchased a Queen Anne-style house for Jack to occupy." (72).

Semes, Steven W. "New Building in Old Cities". *Traditional Building.* (December 2024). p.46-51.

"Our book, New Building in Old Cities: Writings by Gustavo Giovannoni on Architectural and Urban Conservation (Getty Publications, 2024) contains 30 excerpts from his writings on a range of subjects and from throughout his half-century career, framed by interpretive essays placing him and his work in their historical and international contexts. While his examples and case studies are mostly from Rome and Italy, his principles are truly international. The book is organized into six parts whose titles are Italian terms frequently used by Giovannoni." (47).

Tschirch, John R. "Designs on Paper". *Traditional Building.* (December 2024). p.30-32.

"Richard Morris Hunt (1827-1895) worked in this time-honored method; his drawings served as windows onto his evolving aesthetic and how he envisioned and refined architectural schemes. This approach reflected the disciplined training of architects at the Ecole des Beaux Arts, the premier school of the fine arts in Paris during the 19th and early 20th centuries. As the first American to attend the Ecole, Hunt experienced a course of study focused on the rational development of a building's plan and elevations." (30).

### Volner, Ian. "Living Proof". Dwell. (November/December 2024). p.98-101.

"In the meantime, designers and builders are intent on showing how much can be done with the means now available and what might be possible with more and better tools in the future. Architects are expanding the visual language of LIHTC-sponsored housing. Case in point: the Atrium at Sumner, a new 190-unit senior and supportive project in Brooklyn's Bed-Stuy neighborhood. "These building typologies are often very limited," says architect Daniel Libeskind. "But you can turn them around." Renowned for his Jewish Museum in Berlin and the master plan for Manhattan's rebuilt World Trade Center, Libeskind is a relative newcomer to the affordability field, having only recently completed his first such project, on Long Island." "This essay looks at what the claim means if we look carefully at a select few of H&M's projects. Just as the exhibition directors had to devise a strategy for demonstrating the diversity and inventiveness of their work within a limited space and timeframe, so it has been necessary to devise a strategy for focusing on H&M's design methods within the limited framework of a journal essay. Hence, to gain the necessary focus, this essay considers just two pairs of architectural competitions, both for museums of modern and contemporary art- in the cities of London and Berlin- and both won by H&dM."
