"Imagine that you spent 35 years as an engineer with a passionate interest in structure and materials when somebody handed you a material you've never seen before. That visit, back in 2014, changed my life. John introduced me to his daughter, Elora Hardy, founder of architectural practice IBUKU, meaning mother. She had no formal architectural training but had worked for many years with Donna Karan in New York. She grew up in Bali immersed in the world of bamboo. When we met, she had already designed many houses and small buildings in bamboo, including the legendary Sharma Springs villa in Bali. Bamboo is very light, very strong and grows incredibly quickly- as much as 50mm per day. You can almost watch it growing. It's a grass, so when you cut it, it grows again and again ... and again." It is because it is deemed preferable to remove them that eucalyptus was chosen to build the handicraft centre." (40).

"From the stately spires of the Basilica of the Sacred Heart to the lustrous Golden Dome, the buildings on the campus of the University of Notre Dame have long captured a global imagination. And when visitors make their way to the Catholic research institution in South Bend, Indiana, they usually form their first in-person impressions at McKenna Hall, an 87,000-square-foot collegiate Gothic building on Notre Dame Avenue that houses a bustling conference center, meeting rooms, and a range of university offices including the admissions department." "In phase after phase of fearless experimentation, the protean artist Wharton Esherick covered a Pennsylvania hillside with buildings for living, working, and playing. Starting in the 1920s, he supervised local craftspeople and contractors to help dot his wooded acreage in Malvern, about 25 miles northwest of Philadelphia, with polygons and curves. No detail in wood, concrete, stone, metal, or glass was exempt from his imagination and whimsy. Roofs, walls, ceilings, staircases, and even sinks undulate, cantilever, swoop, taper, spiral, or pivot." (21).

"The project's backstory begins with a deal made with the devil when, in 1989, the San Diego Symphony moved into the theater. In the mid- 1980s, a large developer had bought the Fox and erected an office tower on one side of the hotel tower on the other, and a parking garage above, concealing the theater within a concrete-glass-and-steel complex whose public face revealed nary a trace of the 2,250-seat Neo-Spanish Baroque jewel inside. After a simple renovation, they named it Copley Hall. For the next three decades, the symphony dealt with the compromised acoustics and sight lines that came with the aging movie venue." (43).

"To fully gauge these changes, and at the risk of stating the obvious, we need to start by saying a few words about the place of water in architectural history. There are two main themes. One aspect focuses on the poetic, dreamlike, even metaphysical dimensions of water, a whole range of interpretations shaped in particular by Bachelard's reading grid 1. Water's liquid nature goes against the conventional concept of architecture as petrification and opens up an exhilarating imaginary field. For many architects, building thermal baths, or failing that. a swimming pool, remains an object of fantasy." (85).

"The entire body of work, in Dykers's view, is connected-including the firm's latest pass at the typology, the new Far Rockaway Library in Queens. The points of correspondence are indeed striking, especially as regards the facade: where the Egyptian proposal featured runic inscriptions across its white granite exterior, a sort of abstract calligraphy, based on designs by artist José Parlá, creeps across the fritted glass of the Queens project, as though the books inside had overrun their pages and splattered onto the walls." "For designers and builders experienced with custom homes, the key to finding a suitable site is doing a lot of homework. Picking the right site can require a builder's understanding of construction, an excavator's familiarity with local topography, an architect's willingness to investigate the oddest of local codes, an attorney's understanding of which variances you can fight and which you can't, and even a real estate agent's understanding of the context around the property." All of their tools- moulds, clay, potters' wheels and unbaked artworks- are laid on the rammed earth floor, and the artisans sit on low chairs or stools to work." (69).
