

Blander, Akiva. "OMA Designs for Circular Cooking". *Metropolis*. (Summer 2024). p.74-77.

"The project was, in essence, one of gentle refurbishment and reorientation, with a handful of small yet consequential design moves that serve to embed AIR within its surroundings-climatically, spatially, and even experientially. "The biggest architectural move we've done is to turn the front and the back around," says David Gianotten, partner at OMA, who, with associate in charge Shinji Takaqi, led the design." (75).

DiDonna, Bennett. "With a Flourish". *Dwell*. (September/October 2024). p. 84-93.

"It's a sunny morning in Normandy, and the light is beginning to peek through the trees, glimmering across the curved metal roof of Isabelle and Patrice Girard-Donnat's home. Affectionately dubbed Le Kiosque—a nod to the open-walled structures that dot parks across France-the wood house has large sliding glass doors on either side, both of which are open today. As a breeze wafts in from the surrounding garden, the boundary between inside and out truly begins to fade." (86).

Fleming, Sibley. "One Vanderbilt: Supertall creates a 'palpable energy' that speaks to New York's resilience and the future of cities." *UrbanLand.* (Vol 83, No 3. Summer 2024). p.46-51.

"One Vanderbilt stands as an inspiration for other developers to reach for-and implement-the highest technology available. For example, from the observation deck of One Vanderbilt, visitors can see 270 Park Avenue the JPMorgan Chase Building-a 60-story skyscraper about a half mile away that is set to become the tallest New York structure powered wholly by hydroelectric energy when it opens in 2025. Tishman Speyer is its developer, and Foster + Partners Is the architect. One Vanderbilt achieved LEED v4 Gold, which is "night and day harder" than LEED v3, Schantz notes. "They got points for rainwater management and heat island reduction, optimized energy performance, enhanced indoor air-quality strategies, low-emitting materials ... it's a really holistically sustainable building." Lubell, Sam. "How Can We Take Adaptive Reuse to the Next Level". *Metropolis.* (Summer 2024). p.100-103.

"Literally digging into the life span of buildings, Daniel Lutze (MArch candidate, UPenn) proposes Resolve Eternal Structure, in which a "permanent" structure of south-facing marble blocks is woven with a north-facing stepped brick assembly. While the marble is meant to weather over time, the bricks provide a simple surface to promote plant life growth and further building." (102).

Ma, Nathan. "Double Take". Dwell. (September/October 2024). p. 76-83.

"In Lien and Jeremy's home, the palette is limited but not minimal: Bright white, bold blue, dusky pink, and midnight black dominate the space. The four colors are woven throughout the apartment, creating a sense of continuity-and an elegant backdrop for Jeremy and Lien's collection of artwork and furniture. They bought much of their decor and lighting from Belgian retailer Classo, including the mustard-yellow velvet Camaleonda sofa by Mario Bellini. The common areas and bedrooms take up the fourth floor, and a spiral staircase ascends from the living area to a guest suite, which opens to a rooftop terrace." (79).

Plockova, Joann. "The Open Republic". *Azure.* (No 306, September/October 2024). p. 60-64.

"Inside Plato Contemporary Art Gallery in Ostrava, Czechia, several visitors stand around a wall gaping in fascination. They are gazing not at art but rather at a portion of the wall that is slowly rotating open. Thick and putty-grey, the massive moveable architectural feature is adorned with the traces of the window and door once integrated into this part of the building's facade. As it slowly opens into a position fully perpendicular to the structure, the wall reveals the view outside to the Ostrava Stodolní train station across the way and the gallery's surrounding green space." Scholeller, Caroline, Johanny Bonilla Jimenez, Michelle Syl Yeng Chan. "Siaya Eco-Park: A Vision for a Green, Inclusive Hub in Siaya's Heart". *Landscape Architecture Magazine.* (Vol 114, No. 9. September 2024). p.96-97.

"The eco-park's mixed-use development replaces asbestos-contaminated affordable housing that had already been demolished and adds community amenities such as recreational facilities and public bathrooms. The walkable development emphasizes pedestrian connectivity to external services and encourages environmental stewardship with a conservation area, medicinal garden, and community farm. Taking advantage of the sloping site, the eco-park integrates blue-green infrastructure: Rain gardens, cisterns, and an outdoor amphitheater create the framework for stormwater management and collect rainwater for residential use and irrigation." Skidmore, Owings and Merrill. "Wild Mile: Transforming an Urban River into a Floating Eco-Park". *Landscape Architecture Magazine*. (Vol 114, No. 9, September 2024). 172-173.

"The modular kit of parts allows for easy and continual expansion beyond its existing 17 acres. Twelve thousand square feet of floating habitats, riprap, timber, sheet pile, and concrete, create textured and varied surfaces to slow down the water, allowing more flora

and fauna to catch hold and thrive. The jury appreciated the "nice integration of materials and planting to engage guests and promote sustainability." (172).

Snyder, Michael. "Gather Round". Architectural Record. (September 2024). p.72-79.

"Like Canales's previous houses in the Reserva, Casa 720 explores the potentialities of the central patio, a fundamental typology in Mexican architecture, from colonial courtyard houses to multifamily tenements and graceful Modernist projects by luminaries like Mathias Goeritz and Luis Barragán. Here, the permeable central patio, built over a 79,000-gallon cistern, captures water during the six-month rainy season for use throughout the year." (76).

Snyder, Michael. "Set in Stone, and Brick". *Architectural Record.* (September 2024). p.106-111.

"The focal point of Atelier Ars's Promontory Villa, a sprawling six-bedroom weekend house in the pine-cloaked mountains southwest of Guadalajara, Mexico, is a totemic stone chimney rising 23 feet into an open sky against a backdrop of distant hills. Primordial and abstract-the hearth is the most ancient metonym for a home-when separated from a house, it borders on the surreal; the stone tower becomes an anchor, pinning the 9,640-square-foot home to its plot." Tschirch, John R. "Thomas Jefferson's Academical Village". *Traditional Building.* (Vol 37, No. 5. October 2024). p. 38-45.

"Treatment of the university's site reveals Jefferson's adaptive skills. Set on a hill, the Rotunda is at the highest point while The Lawn slopes down in two places as one proceeds along the side ranges with pavilions. The end of The Lawn remained open to the vista of expansive countryside, a symbol of the nation's continuing expansion—the old classical world, history enshrined in the Rotunda; a new world of the future built on classical ideals waiting to be settled in open view. Manifest Destiny, for good or ill, is given architectural form." (42).

Zatarain, Ana Karina. "Take Me to The River: The City had turned its back on the riverbank". *Azure*. (No 306, September/October 2024). p. 78-79.

"Despite its potential to function as a vital public space, the area that lay between the Papaloapan River and the city limits of Tuxtepec — an industrial town in Oaxaca, Mexico — had Z become something of a liability. Locals largely avoided it; a 4. nearby brewery's operations had silted up the water, making it unnavigable, and informal settlements and merchants had cropped up on the unkempt land. Recent years had seen the local

government make occasional efforts to draw families back to the green space — installing playgrounds, soccer fields and basketball courts — but these perfunctory measures inevitably fell short. "The attempts to activate the area were unsuccessful because they were disjointed, rather than being part of a comprehensive plan," explains Alejandro Polo Lamadrid, an architect and urban planner, and the founder of Mexico City-based studio Entorno y Contexto ECO."
